American Girl Sewing / Fashion Show

Rising 3rd – 6th grades (girls) Week 2: June 3-7 9:00 a.m.-11:00 a.m. & 1:00 p.m.-3:00 p.m. \$140 Would you like to learn how to sew? In this class each girl will construct two skirts: one for the student and a matching skirt for her American Girl Doll or favorite stuffed animal. Students will sew on an actual sewing machine. Art / Drama Camp

Participants will connect with a wide variety of media as they create art for our very own art show. Basic level skills on hitting and defense will be taught, including mechanics of the swing, fielding ground balls and fly balls, and throwing. The final day of camp will feature a "coach pitch" whiffle ball tournament. Campers will be divided into groups, each with a leader, so that they may receive as much individual attention as possible.
